You will have access to specialist laboratories and equipment including EEG, virtual reality headsets and eye trackers. 
Our cultural activities and trips included in the programme give you the opportunity to travel and explore Yorkshire and the north of England.


Previous destinations include Whitby, Haworth (home of the Brontë sisters), Castle Howard, Fountains Abbey and the Yorkshire Dales.
